

# General Conditions

1. Exhibitor entries are free and open to all members of approved Orchid Societies. Excluding commercial growers.
2. No one plant may be entered in more than one class.
3. All entries will be received from 4.00 pm and must be tabled no later than 7.00 pm on Friday night for judging. **Judging will commence at 7.30 pm.**
4. All persons not involved in judging must leave the hall by 7.30 pm or earlier on Friday.
5. Plants eligible for competition must have been owned and grown by the exhibitor for at least six months prior to the show
6. Exhibitors are required to label clearly and legibly with the correct plant name & class number. If the plant name has been lost the label should read 'Name Unknown'
7. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to correctly complete the plant labels with the exhibitor's member's number. BOS takes no responsibility for not awarding prizes to plants owner with illegible, wrong or missing number.
8. The only flowering plants other than orchids to be used in displays are anthuriums.
9. Plants eligible for competition must be placed on the show benches in order to be judged. The exception to this rule is for plants in displays class 41. To be entered for judging these plants must be labelled with plant name, class and member's number
10. The judge's decision is final.
11. No plants may be removed to another position, blooms interfered with or plants removed from show benches without the permission of the Chief Steward or Show Captain.
12. The Show Captain and/or Chief Steward have the right to:
  - (a) Reject, remove or re-arrange any entry;
  - (b) Determine the class in which any plant may be entered;
  - (c) Combine and/or establish classes if need be.
  - (d) Reject any plant showing symptoms of pests or diseases
13. The Brisbane Orchid Society Inc. will take all care to safeguard exhibits, but will not accept any responsibility for loss, destruction or damage to the plants.
14. Photographs may be taken, but not during judging. Photographers must take care at all stages to not inconvenience show patrons
15. All exhibitors shall conform to the rules and by-laws of the Brisbane Orchid Society
16. A specimen plant is defined as a mature plant which has been grown from a single clone, has a large number of flowers and shows evidence of good culture over an extended period of time.
17. A Novice exhibitor shall mean a BOS member who has not been excluded from the Novice section of the monthly meetings and who has never won a first place in or higher award in the Novice section of a BOS show.
18. An Intermediate exhibitor shall mean a BOS member who has not been excluded from the Intermediate section of the monthly meetings and who has never won a first place in or higher award in the Intermediate section of a BOS show.
19. Plant staking or tying must conform to **AOC** staking & tying standards. Plants not staked in accordance to those standards may be disqualified. That is no staking or tying on the ovaries
20. Fire Ant regulations must be adhered to and Fire Ant register must be signed for any plants brought into the show.
21. Plants sales on Friday night will be restricted to BOS Members, Exhibitors and Judges only. Plants sales will commence at 5.30 pm and conclude at 7.00 pm.
22. The **Show Executive** (The President, Show Captain & Chief Steward) will be the sole arbiters should matters of dispute arise.
23. The Champion Orchids will be selected from all plants benched including those entered in displays in designated Competition Class Sections.
24. Non BOS Society Members, or visiting members, are eligible to have plants in the plant sales area for sale provided that they have a minimum of two good quality plants benched in the show.
25. Plants must be sold by using and attaching barcodes to plants being sold.
26. Sale of foliage plants, including bromeliads will be allowed but are limited to 20 small to medium plants per member. Foliage plants to be displayed on designated tables and if this area is full they will be stowed under the tables until more area becomes available.
27. All orchids and foliage plants to be sold must be in a good condition and well established in the pot. Bare rooted orchids are allowed for sale.
28. Members from other societies or visiting members, wanting to use their own society barcodes must advise our barcode coordinator Tara Nguyen email [ttnguyen@live.com.au](mailto:ttnguyen@live.com.au) a minimum of one week prior to the BOS show benching to allow for the Barcode system update
29. Visiting members must receive a visiting member number for benching from the show convenor.
30. Visiting members must leave bank details for payment of show prizes with the show convenor.
31. All class prizes are awarded for the first three placings.
32. All orchid entries for exhibiting that do not fit into a designated class shall be accommodated within an appropriate class or a new class
33. First place in Class 32 must be considered as section champion in the appropriate Species or Hybrid champion section within the Show Schedule.
34. **FLORAL ART CONDITIONS**  
Decorative arrangements and corsages may include natural or artificial embellishments, however orchids must predominate.
